2015/10-10 To Consider the Cliff Road Field Entrance

The PC owns the land south of the entrance to Cliff Farm between the road and the field wall to the west of the road, which has been left to nature except for a rough pathway. Wooden posts adjacent to the road are intended to prevent parking on the land. Some of these posts are in disrepair or missing, and parking has started to occur on the PC's land.

There are double yellow lines on the west side of the road throughout and on the east side to just south of the entrance to Cliff Farm. The eastern side of the road is a popular parking place. The fields to the east and south of Cliff Farm to the west are owned by the National Trust and are leased out.

The issue is that farm vehicles entering the NT's fields often need a wider sweep than the entrance ways permit. In respect of the entrance to the western field, some of the wooden posts to the north of the entrance are missing and the adjacent Parish Council land has become rutted and is puddled/ muddy in wet weather. Proposal supported by NT:

- The entrance to the western field is widened, the National Trust taking on maintenance of part of the PC's land to provide this, which it will undertake to
- 2. The NT provides new wooden posts to match existing (about 20 in all) for the PC to install to prevent parking on the verges.

2015/10-13 Parishioners' open comments (15 minutes maximum allowed)

P Tompkins asked that the parking issue in the layby is dealt with ASAP as it has been on the action list for many months.

After the road was resurfaced on the High Street a load of road planning's had been requested to be delivered to P Tompkins with the thought to use them on the footpaths, the Council were not happy to use the planning's on the footpaths as it was felt inappropriate aggregate, Peter Tompkins was happy to use on his own property. The Council/volunteers can use the piles of aggregate in piles owned by NT by agreement with Rowan Thompson for the footpaths where there are issues of excessive mud. Cllr Coatsworth reminded the Council that his DCC divisional fund is now open again; The Council will be making an application for the finials for the fingerposts. He also reported on the Boundary review of DCC and that Bridport now have a North and South seat. That North Dorset, WDDC and W & P BC are now working a in a tri council arrangement. Finally that there have been questions asked about pension fund investments in the County. J Lewis-commented on the clearing of the side of Cliff Road which is being done by volunteers and asked is it the NT who owns the field to the left of Cliff Road this was confirmed by Cllr Moody. J Lewis commented on the edging to the 5 Elms village green that requires repair JL/Clerk/GRM J Lewis-A handrail was to be placed on the bridge over the Bride at the bottom of Clerk Church Road which leads onto Corncrake but part of the handrail support has rotten at the base this was reported last year but no action so to be reported again. Also the plaques on the village green require replacing; this can be dealt with as part of the Lime tree consultation. The access path through Brynvella was reported as being blocked, this has already Clerk been reported, The Clerk to follow up.
