Maintain Corncrake as a park/ walking space with no cattle (x1 agreement)

Many people under impression that would be able to walk around the cows in a fenced off area. SO dogs not worrying cows. It is not that we don't want cows there or meadow re growing

I agree with the fencing - The stock will keep the grass down and won't be there all year. There is always a stock free field available around the village. We are very lucky to have access to the NT land and Corncrake.

Corncrake a highlight of the village - amazing wildflowers over the summer. Should continue to be managed sustainably.

Small area by toilets as a car park good idea - not suitable for grazing till all fencing stock proof. More trees should be added to ancient Hawthorn trees beside new fencing.

No litter bins in the centre of the village - children should be encouraged to use one near their school.

Never yet found the toilets open (*Assume mean Hive Toilets?*)

Question the condition of the river, there are so few fish. How often is the water checked?

Wessex Water preparing forward plans for investment in sewerage works. River fly monitoring of the river Bride may help argument for flood investment in the village.

Promote home insulation across the whole village
